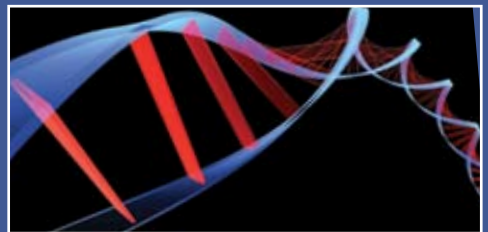

Course Description

Cancer care continues to evolve as new advances in medicine change diagnostic and therapeutic approaches to cancer management. These advances indicate a need to improve clinical practice and develop a better understanding of optimizing care for patients. 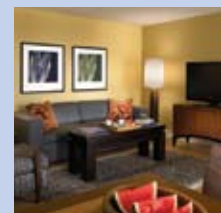
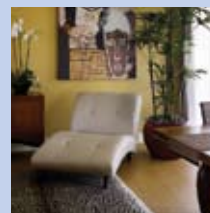
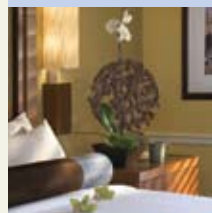
